MARTINSBURG BOROUGH COUNCIL MINUTES AUGUST 4, 2025

The regular meeting of the Martinsburg Borough Council was held on Monday, August 4, 2025 in the municipal building. The meeting started at 7:00 p.m. prayer by Richard Brantner, Jr. and the Pledge of Allegiance.

ELECTED OFFICIALS PRESENT: Mayor Richard A. Brantner, President P. Robert Dickson, Vice-President Edward L. Bennett, Pro-Tem Charles E. Kensinger, Councilman James C. Dell, and Councilman Darin B. Meck [Neil Gartland and Mark Gartland were absent]

In addition to council, present were Borough Manager Richard Brantner, Jr., Secretary/Treasurer Jane Staily, Chief Justin Davis, Attorney Nathan Karn, Dustin Russell, Reba Stuller, and Sandy Weyandt, Nicole Nagle of the Hollidaysburg Ambulance

Nicole Nagle of the <u>HOLLIDAYSBURG AMBULANCE ASSOCIATION</u> was present in the absence of Rob Craig. She reported that they had 64 calls in Martinsburg Borough and North Woodbury Township in July. They also provided 100% ALS coverage for the entire month.

The <u>MINUTES</u> of the meeting of July 7, 2025 were approved on a motion by Charles Kensinger, seconded by Darin Meck. The motion passed unanimously.

The <u>FINANCIAL AND TREASURER'S REPORTS</u> for July 2025 were prepared and presented by Secretary/Treasurer Jane Staily.

The <u>LIST OF BILLS</u> for July 2025, check nos. 11811-11849 in the amount of \$76,739.52 (including transfers to the Reserve Fund totaling \$40,000) approved on a motion by Charles Kensinger, seconded by James Dell. The motion passed unanimously.

MAYOR RICHARD BRANTNER presented his report as written.

Police Chief Justin Davis presented the <u>POLICE REPORT</u> as written. There were 108 complaints handled in the month of July which is two complaints less than last month. Everything went smoothly during parade week. There were little to no incidents. Chief Davis thanked all the various agencies and police departments that helped out that week to make it all possible. It was explained that misdemeanors are more serious crimes than a summary offense. The amount of misdemeanors will be up on next months report.

- JUL 9 borough crew came in an hour early the next morning after the parade and blew off sidewalks and ran the STREET SWEEPER

- JUL 21 completed an online class for <u>FLAGGER TRAINING</u> these classes are good for three years
